




September is Fall Prevention Month

Falls are a leading cause of unintentional injury among adults age 65 years and older. Each year 2.3 million adults over 65 have a fall, leading to serious injury in about 1 in 3 cases. At the local level the picture is even more alarming. In Waukesha County 1,426 people over 65 were hospitalized and 5,112 went to the emergency room due to a fall from 2013 through 2014.

73% of all falls occurred at home. Women represented 80.2% of fall injuries. Bathrooms are particularly dangerous as over 35% of falls occur there.

Falls are preventable and they are not a normal part of aging. Awareness is a big part of preventing falls. The

recommended solutions are paying attention to your surroundings as well as building up strength. Studies have shown that strength building under the supervision of a physical therapist reduced the likelihood of falling as much as 50%. pursuing a healthcare career. He is gaining valuable experience at River View.




