

The facility will employ about 30 workers, who will provide resident care 24 hours a day. City staff recommended the project be approved by Common Council with certain conditions. Necessary approvals include a special use permit as well as site, landscaping and architectural plans.

The proposal comes months after the same development group submitted plans with the city of Milwaukee for a separate senior community on the city's Lower East Side. That project involves the redevelopment of a vacant six-story office building on North Farwell Avenue into a 65-bed facility. Beyond that, Platinum Communities owns and operates six other senior living communities in the state. Teresinski said his company is always looking for opportunities to grow, but did not specify other locations where it may potentially expand.
